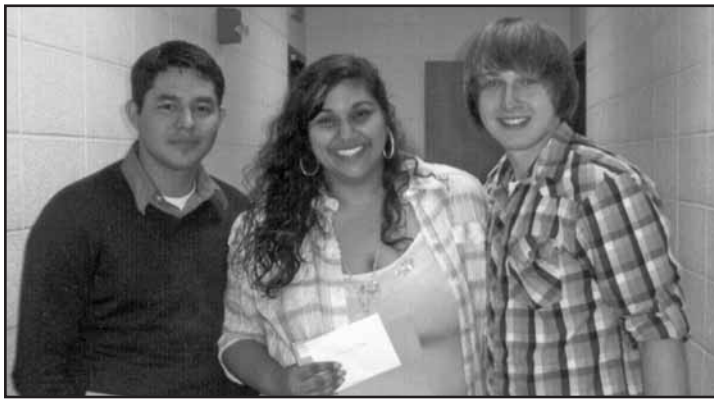

Alternative Education

Returning Students – Tuesday, August 24 at 9:00am – This is for all returning Learning Center students and attendance is **Mandatory** in order to maintain enrollment at the Learning Center.

FERPA Notification

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the School receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the School principal [or appropriate school official] a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The School official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading. Parents or eligible students may ask the School to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the School principal [or appropriate official], clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the School decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the School will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the School as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the School has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the School discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

[NOTE: FERPA requires a school district to make a reasonable attempt to notify the parent or eligible student of the records request unless it states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.]

4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the School to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA are:

Determination of Legal Residency

The parents of pupils residing with relatives who live within the Godwin Heights District shall file with the principal of the school an affidavit stating that the relative is the legal guardian of the child. Other proof of residency must be acceptable to the Board of Education and approved by the school attorney.

(Students may reside with a relative only for the purpose of having a suitable home. Living with a relative for an educational purpose is not allowed under State Law.) The law in the State of Michigan states:

Children placed under the order or direction of courts or child-placing agencies in licensed homes and children whose parents or legal guardians are unable to provide a home for them, and who are placed in licensed homes or in homes of relatives in the school district for the purpose of a suitable home, shall be considered residents for educational purposes of the school district where the homes in which they live are located, and such child or children shall be placed on the school census of said district.

Directory Information Notice

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), a Federal law, requires that Godwin Heights Public Schools, with certain exceptions, obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, Godwin Heights Public Schools may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the District to the contrary in accordance with District procedures. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow the Godwin Heights Public Schools to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications. Examples include:

- A playbill, showing your student's role in a drama production;
- The annual yearbook;
- Honor roll or other recognition lists;
- Graduation programs; and
- Sports activity sheets, such as for wrestling, showing weight and height of team members.

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks. In addition, two federal laws require local educational agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories - names, addresses and telephone listings - unless parents have advised the LEA that they do not want their students' information disclosed without their prior written consent.

If you do not want Godwin Heights Public Schools to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, **you must notify the District in writing.** Godwin Heights Public Schools has designated the following information as directory information:

- Student's name
- Participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- Address
- Telephone listing
- Weight and height of members of athletic teams
- Electronic mail address
- Photograph
- Degrees, honors, and awards received
- Date and place of birth
- Major field of study
- Dates of attendance
- Grade level
- The most recent educational agency or institution attended

Notice Of Nondiscrimination

The Godwin Heights Public Schools Board of Education does not discriminate on the basis or religion, race, color, national origin, sex, disability, or age in its program, activities, or employment.

Student Suspension/Expulsion Policy

The authority of the Board of Education to authorize suspension or expulsion and to make reasonable rules and regulations regarding discipline is granted in the Michigan School Laws.

A. Authorization of board to make rules and regulations.

The Board of a school district shall have authority to make reasonable regulations relative to anything necessary for the proper establishment, maintenance, management and carrying on of the public schools of such district, including regulations relative to the conduct of pupils concerning their safety while in attendance at school or en route to and from school.

B. Suspension and expulsion of pupils.

The Board may authorize or order the suspension or expulsion from school of any pupil guilty of gross misdemeanor or persistent disobedience whenever in the Board's judgment the interests of the school may demand the authorization or order. If there is reasonable cause to believe that the pupil is handicapped, and the school district has not evaluated the pupil in accordance with the rules of the state board, the pupil shall be evaluated immediately by the intermediate school district of which the school district is constituent in accordance with Section 1711 of the Michigan School Laws. (Note: Section 1711 describes the powers and duties of the intermediate school district in the evaluation and placement of pupils in special education programs.)

C. Definitions.

- 1. Removal from class** - This is the removal of a student(s) for the remainder of a class period. It is the result of student behavior disrupting the educational process.
- 2. Closing of classes** - This is removal from a class or classes by the principal or his/her duly authorized agent. This may be for varying lengths of time and may require a parent conference.
- 3. Suspension from Class** - Classroom teachers may suspend a student from a subject, a class, or activity for up to one school day by following the provisions in JGD/JGE-R.
- 4. Suspension** - This is removal from school for a designated period of time due to a violation of school rules and regulations. This includes attendance at the Skills Center and in the cooperative education program. The student is not allowed on school premises during the duration of the suspension. He/she may not participate in, or attend, any school activity such as athletic events, music concerts, plays, etc. during the duration of the suspension.
- 5. Expulsion** - This is removal from school on a long-term or permanent basis. The action may only be taken by the Board of Education.

Weapon Free School Zone

The Board of Education of Godwin Heights Public Schools, as both an employer and a public school district, is concerned with and interested in protecting the health, safety, and welfare of students, employees, and visitors. The Board recognizes that school buildings facilities, vehicles, grounds and other school property are best utilized in the educational process in the absence of threats to physical well-being and safety, by individuals possessing weapons and/or dangerous weapons.

Accordingly, the Board of Education of Godwin Heights Public Schools (or the Superintendent, a principal or other district official as may be designated by the Board) shall permanently expel a pupil from attending school in the school district, if the pupil possesses a weapon in a weapon free school zone. Such expulsion is mandatory, unless the pupil establishes in a clear and convincing manner, at least one of the following:

1. That the object or instrument possessed by the pupil was not possessed for use as a weapon, or for direct or indirect delivery to another person for use as a weapon.
2. The weapon was not knowingly possessed by the pupil.
3. The pupil did not know or have reason to know that the object or the instrument possessed by the pupil constituted a weapon or dangerous weapon.
4. The weapon was possessed by the pupil at the suggestion, request, or direction of, or with the express permission of, school or police authorities.

Mandatory expulsion is also required for the commission of arson or criminal sexual conduct.

Expulsions mandated under this policy shall be imposed in accordance with the procedures for student discipline as established by the school district and as set forth in the student handbook or other appropriate documents.

Advisory To All Parents

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Godwin Public Schools has adopted an Integrated Pest Management program. Inherent with this are the District's efforts to reduce pesticide use as much as possible. While it may occasionally be necessary to apply a pesticide, these will only be used as a last resort. This program **does not** rely on routine pesticide applications to resolve problems. We use various techniques such as habitat alteration, sanitation, mechanical means, exclusion, etc. to prevent pest from becoming a problem.

You will receive advanced notice of the application of a pesticide, other than bait or gel formulations at your child's school. This advance notice of the application will be given 48 hours before the application. The law requires us to do this notification by using two methods. The first method required by the law is the posting at the primary entrances to your child's school. The entrances that will be posted are those entrances that have a sidewalk that leads directly to a parking lot. The second method we are going to use is the posting in a common area located by the main office of the school. Parents are also entitled to receive this notice by first-class United States mail postmarked at least 3 days before the application. If you would like to be notified by mail please contact the Operations Department at the following number 252-2083. Please give the Operations secretary your name, mailing address and what school your child attends.

In an emergency (for example, bees nest), pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but you will be provided notice following any such application.

You may review our IPM program or pesticide application records for your child's school by calling or e-mailing the District's Director of Operations at phone number 252-2083 or e-mail address johnson@godwinschools.org. This number or e-mail may also be used when school is not in regular session.

AHERA News

In compliance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1986, the Godwin Heights Public School System is required to make public notification of the availability of the district's asbestos management plan. This plan is available for public inspection at our offices without cost or restriction during the normal business hours. If you do desire to have a personal copy, please notify the main administrative office, and it will be supplied to you within five (5) working days at a cost of \$.30 per page.

Student Insurance

For the 2010/11 school year, Godwin Heights Public Schools again has purchased student insurance from First Agency, located in Kalamazoo, Michigan. The insurance program is a supplemental plan which means your family insurance plan is the first source of payment when an injury occurs. Expenses not covered by the family plan would then be available for payment by the First Agency Plan. As with all medical plans, these expenses are subject to the limitations and exclusions of this supplemental insurance plan provided by First Agency.

Limitations or exclusions in the plan are found in the areas of:

- 1) sickness, 2) fighting, 3) orthodontics unless exclusively for rehabilitation, 4) hernia, 5) use of electric bio-mechanical devices,
- 6) claims not filed within 90 days after treatment ends,
- 7) expenses incurred beyond 52 weeks from date of accident,
- 8) initial treatment must begin within 60 days of accident, and
- 9) existing conditions aggravated by an accident.

In the event a family does not have medical insurance coverage the First Agency Plan would become the first line of coverage.

Special Note: Families having coverage under a PPO Plan will need to follow the guidelines set forth by the PPO company in order for the insurance plan to be effective.

The student insurance plan provides coverage for all Godwin Heights students while in attendance at school during the day, attending school sponsored field trips, and participating in school sponsored interscholastic athletics. Additional information regarding student insurance may be obtained by calling 257-2090.
